### Outdoor Fire Safety

Engaging in outdoor activities is a great way to spend time with the family; therefore, it is important to be sure that these activities do not put anyone at risk for fires or burns. No open fires are permitted in the town for the purpose of burning leaves, trash or other combustible material. Private incinerators are not allowed. Outdoor fireplaces used for cooking and or recreational heating purposes are allowed. Only cut natural firewood can be used in outdoor fireplaces. Any outdoor fireplaces in use must be supervised by a competent adult and have a useable extinguishing device (fire extinguisher, water hose, etc.) within fifty (50) feet. Any fire that is a nuisance to adjoining property owners must be extinguished. Any yard debris in need of disposal can be placed at the street for pick up by public works. Enjoy your summer and be safe. Contact the Selma Fire Department for more information on fire safety, and as always ensure you have a working smoke detector on every level of your home and at each sleeping area. Selma Fire Department has smoke detectors available.
