The ongoing improvements in our town that I mentioned in the previous edition of Selma Tracks are continuing. We are seeing heightened interest in our residential, business, and commercial areas.

In Downtown Selma, a ribbon cutting was held for Home Towne Realty in February and Adventure Development has moved their office to what is known as the Vick Building. Other businesses on the horizon include a day spa, financial services business, and a business focused on paintings and other art pieces. As you can see, the diversity of offerings in our downtown that we have been seeking is increasing. We are also continuing to recruit restaurants and general merchandise stores that are frequently requested by citizens and tourists. As you know, restaurants are one of the business sectors that have been hardest hit during the pandemic which has slowed the launch of new ones.

Not only is the diversity of businesses increasing, but the structural quality of the buildings is improving because of the restoration and rehabilitation being done by property owners. Work is now underway at the south end of downtown to restore the facades of several buildings. Two buildings on Waddell Street are expected to be either demolished and replaced with new buildings or to undergo extensive renovation. This is critical to the resiliency of this area and it is contributing to the transformation of Downtown Selma.

As new businesses open in Downtown Selma or in any other business areas such as along Highway 301, I-95, or Highway 70, I invite you to join me in patronizing them as well as our existing businesses.
