

# RECYCLING SERVICE DEFINED

Recycling Service consists of 1-65 gallon container serviced curbside weekly

- The average recycling tonnage collected per week is 4.53 tons
  - The recycling material is taken to Sonoco's Recycling Processing facility in Raleigh. The current recycling processing fee is \$55.63 per ton. This expense fluctuates monthly and is expected to continue to increase in the coming months

# RECYCLING CONTINUED

Acceptable Recycling materials are defined as plastic, metal, glass and paper

Please flatten or break down all boxes

We will confirm current resident participation % over the next several weeks

# RECYCLING CONTINUED

It is very important not to contaminate the Recycling Stream. Your recycling container should not be a back up trash can. The contamination limits have been reduced to .05%. Processors are handing out fines and disposal fees associated with contamination.

# TRASH SERVICE DEFINED

Trash Service consists of 1-96 gallon container serviced curbside  
Solid waste materials resulting from normal household activities

- Please place containers out the night before
  - No loose trash should be outside the can
- Please bag your trash to reduce blown litter when its windy outside, this also helps keep your container cleaner & reduces smells
- Keep 3 feet between containers to give the automated truck room to operate
  - Place can away from mailboxes and parked cars
- If a residence generates extra trash frequently they need to pay for an additional container
  - The average tonnage collected per week is 44.05 tons
- The solid waste is disposed of at the Wilson Transfer Station (\$51.15 per ton) and at Johnston County Landfill (\$37 per ton) . Disposal cost is paid for by contractor and is included in Pricing

# BULK SERVICES DEFINED

- Bulk items are collected on Mondays
- The average weekly bulk tonnage collected is 1.78 tons
- This tonnage is taken to the Wilson Transfer Station disposal facility

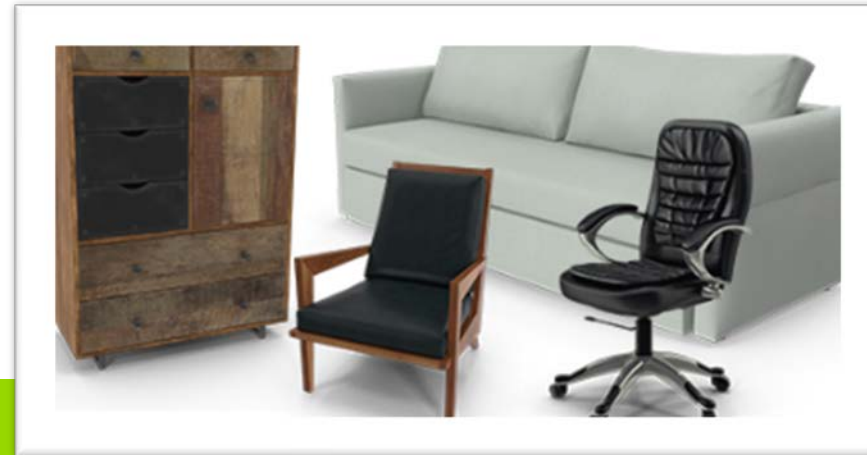
# BULK SERVICE CONTINUED

## Bulk Item Pick Up – What is normal Bulk

Bulk items resulting from normal household activities that are typically too large to be disposed of in your regular curbside trash container, generally due to weight and size. Bulk items include sofas, furniture, mattresses, appliances with Freon removed



We do not pick up mattresses or items infested with bed bugs



# BULK SERVICE CONTINUED

## What is not considered normal household bulk?

TV's (e-waste), tires, car batteries, flammable liquids, paint, motor or cooking oils, hazardous waste, propane tanks, appliances including Freon, construction and demolition debris, car parts, house clean outs



# EDUCATION MATERIALS

- We will work with the town to provide town residents with educational material to be posted on the Towns Website & social media outlets
- The included recycling flyer can be posted to help reduce contamination in the recycling stream
- These bulk pickup slides can be utilized to help educate town residents on what items should be at the curb for bulk pickup
- We will work with public works on other materials that will be helpful with collection or as needs arise



# EDUCATION MATERIAL EXAMPLES

**RECYCLING**  
\* ALL MATERIALS MUST BE CLEAN, DRY & EMPTY! \*

**YES**

- PAPER** for communication (newsprint, catalogs, mail, brochures)
- CARDBOARD & BOXBOARD** (flat or corrugated, empty product boxes)
- GLASS • METAL • PLASTIC** (bottles, cans, tubs & packaging)

IT IS ILLEGAL TO PUT NON-RECYCLABLE ITEMS IN THIS CONTAINER.

**NO**

- NO Trash
- NO Styrofoam of any kind
- NO Plastic bags & wrap
- NO Paper cups, food wraps
- NO Fluorescent bulbs & tubes
- NO Hazardous containers
- NO Furniture, electronics, appliances

- Metals**: All Aluminum Cans and Metal Food and Drink Containers. *Please Rinse Food Waste Before Recycling.*
- Plastic Bottles and Containers**: Beverage Bottles, Colored Plastic, Milk & Juice Cartons, Household Cleaning Supply Bottles. *Please Empty and Wash Containers.*
- Paper Products**: Flattened Cardboard, Gift Wrap Paper, Junk Mail & Envelopes, Newspaper, Office, Computer, and Notebook Paper.

**NO**

- Ceramics and Glass**: Bottles and Jars, Light Bulbs, Plates, Pots, Window Glass.
- Plastic Bags**: Bubble Wrap, Compostable Bags, Plastic Toys, Plastic Wrap.
- Polystyrene #6**: Plastic Cups, Plastic Plates, Plastic Utensils, Styrofoam.
- Used Paper Products**: Napkins, Paper Cups & Plates, Paper Towels, Pizza Boxes, Shredded Paper.

**NO MEDICAL WASTE, NO HAZARDOUS WASTE AND NO LITHIUM BATTERIES ARE ALLOWED IN BOTH TRASH AND RECYCLING.**

# EDUCATION MATERIAL EXAMPLES



## WE'RE ROLLING OUT YOUR ROLLING CARTS

Effective June 1st, the Town of Fairview will make the switch to Automated Collection.

The residents will be supplied with two carts, one black cart labeled "Garbage Only" and one blue cart labeled "Mixed Recyclables Only".

Your collection day for both garbage and recyclables will now be on Wednesdays.

### HOW TO USE YOUR ROLLING CARTS

1. Place bagged waste inside the black cart & recyclables in the blue cart.
2. Roll your carts curbside on collection day by 7:00 am and ensure you remove them by the end of the day.
3. Ensure wheels/handles are facing inward toward your home with wheels touching the edge of the street or curb.
4. Be sure there is one meter of clearance on all sides of the carts and overhead - this includes between the garbage & recycle cart, parked cars, fences & trees beside or above.

## DON'T TANGLE OR CONTAMINATE RECYCLE MORE FOR A GREENER STATE
